Course Description

Crisis Intervention is a specialized acute emergency mental health intervention which requires specialized training. Much like physical first aid provides immediate short-term care, crisis intervention is sometimes called “emotional first aid”. This program is designed to teach participants the fundamentals of, and a specific protocol for, individual crisis intervention. This class will particularly focus on the application of individual intervention with first-responders, but will be useful for anyone who desires to increase their knowledge of individual (one-on-one) crisis intervention techniques in the fields of Business & Industry, Crisis Intervention, Disaster Response, Education, Emergency Services, Employee Assistance, Healthcare, Homeland Security, Mental Health, Military, Spiritual Care, and Traumatic Stress.
